Lake Jackson is bisected by US Highway 27, which forms an impassable barrier to turtles, frogs, snakes, and other wildlife that attempt to migrate between the two sections of the lake. Over 8,500 individual turtles have been documented attempting to migrate across US 27 at this site. A temporary fence has saved many of these turtles, but public support is needed to convince government officials to construct a permanent ecopassage.
